Current research on John Calvin and Reformed Traditions

Submission Deadline: 1 November 2021

The **Calvin Studies Society** invites current and recent doctoral students to submit paper abstracts for a graduate student panel to be held at the next Calvin Studies Colloquium, 31 March – 2 April 2022 at Wheaton College. The topic of the Colloquium is “Calvin, Women, and the Gender.”

We invite proposals for papers reflecting current research by doctoral students or those awarded a Ph.D. in the past two years (2019-2021) on any topic related to Calvin and Calvinism. Abstracts should be no longer than 300 words and should state the main research question to be addressed in the paper. Presented papers should be approximately 10 pages long; presenters will be given 20 minutes each. Please submit your proposal to Dr. Jennifer Powell McNutt, Vice President of the Board of the Society via the online portal (www.calvinstudiessociety.org/grad-student-submission).

The Society will cover registration and arrange housing for selected panel presenters.

The primary purpose of the Calvin Studies Society is to engage in and promote the study of the thought, life, and times of John Calvin. The Society also focuses on other figures and subjects related to the Reformed movement of the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries.
